

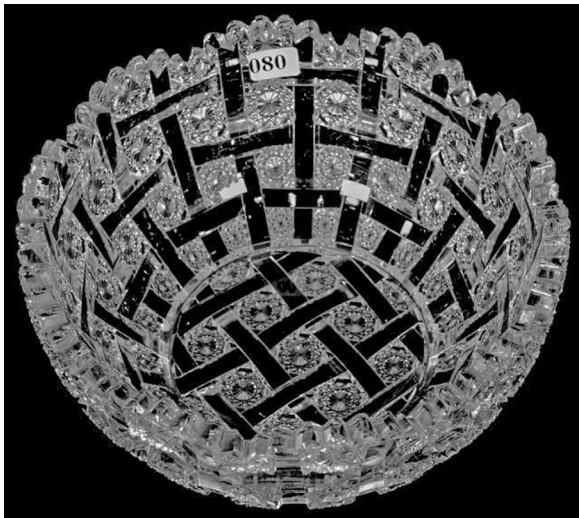
Hobstar Preview: October 2015



Two 11 3/4" tall cased green cut to clear Dorflinger vases sold at the 9/12/15 Woody Auction in St. Charles, MO. (left) **Montrose** pattern, top seller at \$8,000; (right) second highest lot sold at \$7,500.



“**Appreciating Small Treasures**” by LindaJo Hare points out that small cut glass items miniaturize the designs seen on larger pieces. These were probably created as small gifts given in glass worker families, or were included with larger orders as “Thank You” presents to better customers. Five smalls are pictured.



Third highest seller at the Woody Auction was this 9" bowl cut and signed by Hawkes in their **Willow** pattern.
